## FROM YOUR PASTOR

#### "He is not here. He is risen!"

Those few words form the very heart of our faith. Without the empty tomb, we would be lost in the mire and mess of the world. Without the substantiation of the empty tomb, Jesus would be relegated to the status of just another great teacher, or prophet, not the Messiah and Savior that we know.

Even death could not hold Him, and the resurrection opened the door to eternal life for all who call upon His name. That's what makes Easter the great celebration of new life, second chances and victory over all that might appear at first to be defeat. So... hear it loud and clear... He is no longer in the tomb! He is Risen!

But there are other parts of the Easter story that also have profound implications for us. The angel said, "Do not be afraid". The body was gone. But this was not the end. It was just the beginning. Fear can either cause us to run and hide, or to be bold in facing the unknown and the uncertain. The words to the wonderful Easter hymn ring out in my mind this morning... "Because He Lives, I can face tomorrow. Because He Lives, all fear is gone." Those that heard the angel that first Easter morning certainly faced fear, confusion, and uncertainty. But they acted faithfully. What about us? Are we able to act faithfully, even when we're afraid?

The women that came to the tomb found it to be empty, and were confronted by an angel. In the story, we hear the angel tell them to "Go and tell". Those words were directed first to the women, then to the early disciples, and to each of us today. If we truly believe the Easter story, how can we not shout that message from every rooftop, and share it with everyone we know and love? Hopefully, this Easter season, we will rethink this call to "Go and Tell," and make it a more important part of our lives.
